❖ Skills required to take part in the course

To take part in this level 2 course, you need to have mastered most of the techniques [listed here](#).

❖ Programme

Simple counterpoint

- rhythmic faux-bourdon
- *bassus* in 3/5 and 3/5/8
- «mixed» contraténor

Diminished counterpoint

- for 2 voices : various constraints
- for 4 voices : 3 voices upon a bass

Canons

- at the fifth
- for 3 voices

Singing upon the book, singing upon the hand

These techniques are usually based on a basic melody, the *cantus firmus*. Depending on the case, the *cantus firmus* will be read on a staff or shown on the hand (known as 'guidonian hand'), the two modes of visualisation being complementary.

❖ Activities

The work takes place in different sequences: presentation of improvisation techniques and associated instructions (in a large group); putting the instructions into practice (in small groups of 2 to 5, with coaching from the teachers); shared feedback (in a large group).

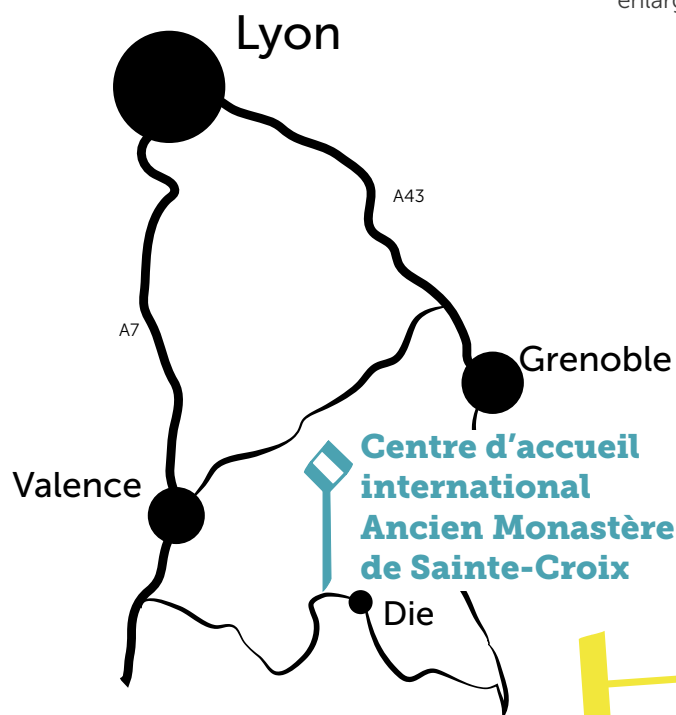
