# Skills required to take part in the course

To take part in this level 3 course, you need to have a good command of most of the techniques <u>listed here</u>.

# Programme

## Simple counterpoint

- altus upon bassus in 3/5
- all voices with imitations

# Diminished counterpoint

- contrapunto in concerto
- 10ths around a CF
- 2 diminished voices above a CF

### Canons

- at the fourth
- upon a CF

# Singing upon the book, singing upon the hand

These techniques are most often based on a basic melody, the cantus firmus (CF). Depending on the case, the cantus firmus will be read on a staff or shown on the hand (known as 'quidonian hand'), the two modes of visualisation being complementary.

# Activities

The work takes place in different sequences: presentation of improvisation techniques and associated instructions (in a large group); putting the instructions into practice (in small groups of 2 to 5, with coaching from the teachers); shared feedback (in a large group).
